It is possible that the Gwaltney daughter was someone else, who died before March 1732, and Edward Boykin, Jr., married again. Many people think his wife Judith was a Wall, daughter of Richard Wall; however, Judith Wall married William Deloach, and this couple moved into South Carolina with Edward Boykin III. Another candidate is Judith Hill, daughter of William Hill; however, I don't know of any documentation of the existence of a Judith Hill.

Alice Flake and William Gwaltney were married and the parents of three children, named by Robert Flake, Sr., in his will of 1 Jul 1696. Alice Flake was his daughter.

Thomas Gwaltney was born by at least 1680. He was in the tax records with his father by 1696. William Gwaltney was born by at least 1681. Katherine Gwaltney was born by at least 1683.

Other Gwaltney children were not named.
